## **The Seven Cooperative Principles**

- 1. **Voluntary and open membership:** Open to all persons able to use our services and willing to accept the responsibilities of membership
- 2. Democratic member control: Controlled by our members, who actively participate in setting policies and making decisions
- **3. Members' economic participation:** Our members contribute equitably to, and democractically control, the capital of the cooperative
- **4. Autonomy and independence:** We are autonomous, self-help organizations controlled by our members
- **5. Education, training, and information:** We provide education and training for our members, elected representatives, managers, and employees
- Cooperation among cooperatives: We serve our members by working with local, national, regional, and international structures
- 7. Concern for community: While focusing on member needs, we work for the sustainable development of our communities through policies accepted by our members
